Children may bring a book they do not want any more and swap with books brought in by other children. Please note that the children will not get their original book back.

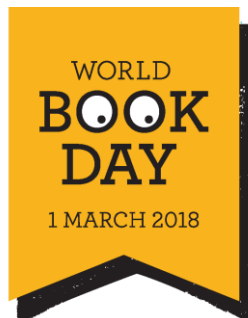
We would also ask parents if they would be able to make a voluntary donation of 50p so that we can send unwanted books to children in Africa. However, there is no obligation to do so.
